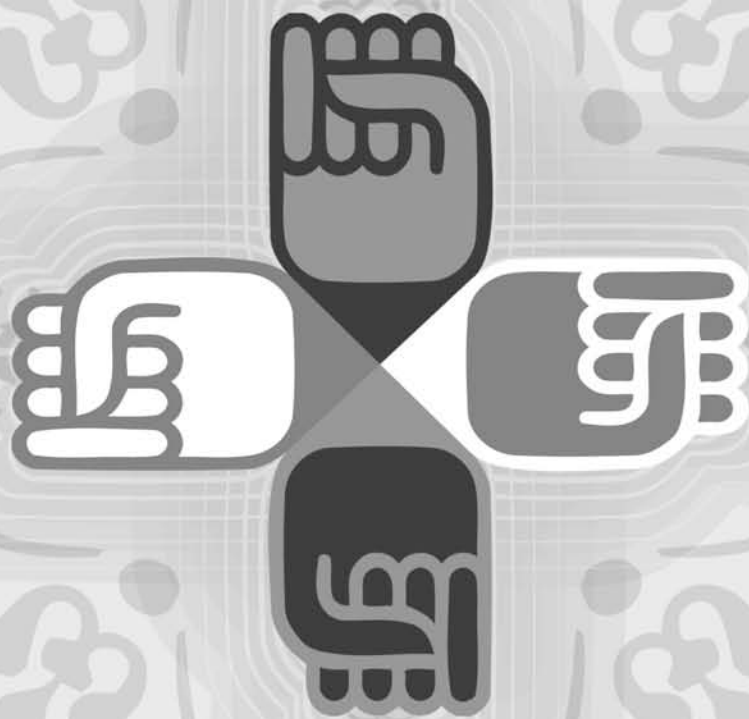


SOLIDARITY

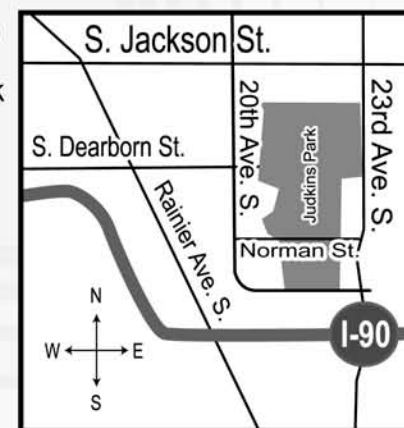
