El Centro de la Raza was founded in 1972 to address the problems that people face related to cultural differences, literacy, health, racism, education, income and assets.

HISTORY

El Centro de la Raza's journey began on October 11, 1972 when Latino staff, students and families peacefully occupied the abandoned Beacon Hill Elementary School near downtown Seattle. The core group was part of the English and Adult Basic Education Program at the Duwamish branch of South Seattle Community College, a program of the War on Poverty that was defunded after less than two years.

The occupation was widely supported by Native American, African American, Asian and Caucasian people. Thus, a commu-

nity was created in a building without running water or heat negotiations and with the City of Seattle and Seattle Public Schools led to the



eventual approval by the city council and the mayor of a five-year lease of the building for \$1 a year.

Over 30 years later, El Centro owns the building outright. The name, El Centro de la Raza, is best translated as: "The Center of the People of all Races." El Centro receives and welcomes individuals and families of all races and fights to make a better and more just world for everyone.

HUMAN SERVICES

Senior Nutrition & Wellness: We address six areas of wellness for seniors including: emotional, physical, social, intellectual, spiritual, and vocational health. Seniors receive nutrition education, nutritious daily lunches, home delivered meals, and a weekly grocery bag from our food bank. Seniors partake in various social and educational activities, and exercise classes are offered three

Hours: 8:30-5:30, M-F **Homeless Assistance:** We address the issue of homelessness by providing comprehensive housing assistance to homeless families. Participants receive case management focused on stabilization and maintaining permanent, affordable housing. We focus on issues that cause families to become homeless, and assist with some move-in expenses, rent subsidy and partner with local landlords to place families in affordable, quality housing. Infant Mortality Prevention: We address the issue of infant mortality by offering advocacy, access and assistance through case management, outreach and workshops for women of childbearing age, pregnant women and women with children under three to reduce the risk of infant mortality, as well as increase the health of both woman and child. 

EDUCATION & SKILL BUILDING

First Time Homebuyer Education: We seek to prepare new Americans for homeownership by empowering them through Homebuyer Counseling and First Time Homebuyer Seminars. Our homeownership education workshops cover down-payment assistance, mortgages, predatory lending, and credit building. Call: 206.957.4633

Financial Literacy: Financial literacy education workshops help our participants anticipate purchases and generate a budget to strengthen their awareness of spending habits. Participants can enroll in an Individual Devel-

Job Readiness & Life Skills Training: To help end the cycle of homelessness, this multi-layered program provides employment assistance and soft skills training relevant to homeless, low-income families so that they increase their wages, maintain employment, and know their rights. Seattle Team for Youth: In partnership with Seattle Public Schools, we offer comprehensive case management services to, but not limited to, Latino youth ages 11-21 who reside in Seattle and are at-risk of dropping out or have dropped out of school. We have offices at Chief Sealth and Cleveland High Schools and Denny Middle School. The objective of this program is to provide youth with the tools and resources they need to succeed academically.
